

## Teacher/Scholar in Residence Program

This program is designed to honor and promote excellence in teaching among tenured, mid-career, and senior faculty. The Teacher/Scholar in Residence Program (TSR) hinges on the premise that excellence in teaching is a necessity in the development of an effective learning environment. The program is designed to provide support and a context that will permit faculty to share their experiences, enrich their expertise, and recognize and reward excellence in the classroom. Teacher/Scholars will have the opportunity to deepen and extend their expertise in teaching and in instructional technology in collaboration with a supportive group of campus colleagues. During their tenure as Teacher/Scholars, selected faculty will share their training and experience with colleagues in their college and on campus. Seven faculty representing each college will be selected and honored every two years.

### Roles and Responsibilities

- Advise the FDC and VPAA on issues related to supporting teaching effectiveness.
- Consult with the Dean on issues and programs to support faculty and teaching in their College.
- Participate in monthly meetings/workshops and other sessions for Teacher/Scholars.
- Be available to be contacted by other faculty for guidance and consultation, present workshops, and/or be willing to provide scheduled access to their classroom for other faculty.
- Serve for two years.

### Rewards

- Honorific campus recognition as a CUSF Teacher/Scholar in Residence.
- Enhanced opportunities for personal and professional development in teaching and/or technology.
- Opportunity to positively impact other faculty members.
- Priority technology support from the FDC tech staff.
- \$2,000 stipend for the duration of the program (\$1000 per year).
- Inscription on the Teacher/Scholar in Residence perpetual plaque.

### Selection Process

Teacher/Scholars in Residence must be tenured, mid-career or senior faculty, nominated by any faculty, Chair, Dean, or academic administrator or self-nominated. All applications should include a brief statement of the candidate's record of excellence and commitment to teaching and should be submitted to the appropriate Dean.

Candidates will be required to submit:

1. A completed application form, including a statement from the faculty member expressing interest and reason for wanting to participate in the program.
2. A brief statement of teaching philosophy, including (if pertinent) evidence of proficiency in the interactive use of instructional technologies in the classroom.
3. Current Vita.
4. Brief supporting letter from the Department Chair.

- Applications are **due in the Dean's office by 5 p.m. Friday, May 11, 2001.**
- Deans' recommendations are due to the FDC by 5 p.m. Thursday, May 17, 2001.
- TSR faculty will be notified by Monday, May 21, 2001.
